Information for Coaches

- Each team must be accompanied by a coach.
- ENMU Greyhound Basketball Camps does not provide coaches for teams.
- The coach is responsible for his/her team at all times.
- Each team MUST have at least 8 players. We recommend 10 players due to the number of games being played.
- Teams must provide their own jerseys (reversibles are best).
- Teams provide their own warm-up balls.
- Teams must keep all facilities clean.
- Teams provide their own linens for the dorms.
- ENMU trainers are available for injury treatments. Each team is responsible for their own training supplies and preventative treatments.
- All games will be played in Greyhound Arena.
- Teams will play 15 or 16 games.
- All teams play in the camp tournament.

Head Coach Shawn Scanlan

Camp Director

Shawn Scanlan, in his sixth season as head basketball coach at Eastern New Mexico University,

is the camp director for all Greyhound Team Camps. Scanlan entered 2005-06 with a 68-69 career record at ENMU, including 64-47 the past four years.

In 2003-04, Eastern earned an NCAA Division II Tournament berth and a 20-9 overall record for the Hounds' second consecutive 20-win season. ENMU won its second straight Lone Star Conference South Division title at 10-2. In 2002-03, Scanlan led the Hounds to a 20-8 record and an LSC South title at 11-1. He was named LSC South Coach of the Year.

Scanlan, 50, earned a record of 97-57 (.630) in five years at South Plains College (juco). He coached the Texans to conference championships in 1995-96 and 1996-97. South Plains gualified for the NJCAA regional tournament four times.

Prior to arriving at South Plains, Scanlan was the head coach at Kilgore College (juco) from 1990-95. Kilgore achieved an overall record of 101-56 (.643).

He coached Kilgore to the NJCAA National Tournament in 1994. He also led the Rangers to the Region XIV title in 1994 and to a conference title in 1991. Kilgore earned five postseason berths.

While coaching at Kilgore, Scanlan was named TEAC Coach of the Year in 1991. He was chosen NJCAA Region XIV Coach of the Year in 1994.

His first collegiate head coaching position was at Paris Junior College. In four years, he led PJC to a 70-47 (.598) record and three postseason berths.

His overall junior college record was 268-160 (.626). He led his teams to 12 postseason berths in 14 years and won three conference titles.

Scanlan received a bachelor's degree in Education from the University of Kansas in 1978. He earned a master's degree in P.E. and Administration at Baylor in 1982. While at Baylor, he was an assistant coach for two seasons (1980-82).

Scanlan was a head coach at Burleson High School (Texas) from 1982-86. His coaching career began at Ransom High School (Kansas) in 1979-80.

General Greyhound Team Camps Information

Team Limits

All Greyhound Team Camps are limited to 24 teams. Teams are admitted to each camp on a first-come, first-served basis.

Deposit

A \$150 non-refundable deposit secures each team a spot in the camp. The first 24 teams with a deposit will be admitted.

Insurance

All campers must provide their own health insurance and accident insurance.

Registration



Each head coach will be compensated \$150 for the supervision of his/her team during camp.


